Our Christmas newsletter reports on a highlight at the end of the year: For the second time, we were able to successfully support Geberit in the implementation of their social project. And never before in our almost 10-year history have we had so many activities that you can support directly. But first things first...



Geberit and Kamboo Project complete the “Geberit Social Project 2024” on time and on budget

The globally active Geberit Group is the European market leader for sanitary products and is celebrating its 150th anniversary in 2024. Geberit has successfully completed the “Geberit Social Project 2024” in collaboration with Kamboo Project. Every year since 2008, Geberit has enabled its apprentices to realize social projects in poorer countries. This year, under the leadership of two Geberit employees and with the support of the Kamboo Project team, a total of ten apprentices were active in Cambodia and worked at the Svay Thom Primary & Secondary School.

The measures included the installation of 10 toilets, 5 urinals, 2 hand-washing stations and the construction of 5 new classrooms for more than 1800 pupils. In addition, the teams conducted hygiene workshops to communicate the importance of hand washing and dental hygiene.

The partnership with the school, which has been in place since 2018, has strengthened trust between the partners. The school has seen growing enrolment figures and an improvement in hygiene and educational conditions. The sustainability of the project is ensured through continuous monitoring. This commitment will benefit thousands of children in the long term.

The project is an example of successful social responsibility and intercultural exchange. Many thanks to Geberit for their great commitment!

A particular focus is on creating clean and safe school environments and providing basic hygiene training for teachers and students. Through targeted WASH initiatives at various elementary school in the Prasat Bakong district, the project raises health standards for both pupils and teachers. At the same time, it promotes the dissemination of this knowledge in the local communities and thus contributes to improving public health in the region.

PROJECT AGAINST EARLY MARRIAGE: A yes-word for education and self-determination

Cambodia has one of the highest rates of child marriage in Southeast Asia. Affected girls usually have to drop out of school and run the risk of becoming victims of domestic violence. Kamboo Project is working hard to end child marriage in the Prasat Bakong district by empowering girls and families through education and awareness-raising. The aim is to create a future in which every Cambodian girl has the freedom to shape her own path in life.

BICYCLE-PROJECT: Mobility of learners

Long distances to schools are a major obstacle to education for many children in rural Cambodia. Kamboo Project has set itself the task of overcoming this obstacle by distributing bicycles among schoolchildren. Since 2019, over 300 children in the Prasat Bakong district have already been helped to get to school safely and in a reasonable amount of time. Through close cooperation with local schools and community representatives, a careful selection is made of those who are most in need of this form of support.

BICYCLE REPAIR PROJECT for sustainable ways to school

In rural Cambodia, many children who live further away from schools are provided with bicycles to give them access to education. However, due to normal wear and tear, many of these bicycles sooner or later become unusable. Kamboo Project is responding to this with a special initiative to repair and supply spare parts. The aim is to ensure smooth and continuous access to education for the more than 10,000 pupils at 52 elementary school in the Prasat Bakong district.
